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PERSONAL LETTER from Blanche Declouet, at the Sacred Heart Convent in Grand Coteau, to her brother, Paul Declouet, at Brookland School in Greenwood Depot, Virginia.

Grand Coteau, the 26th of January, 1859

Dear Paul,

You perhaps think that I forget you because since my return to the convent I have written to you but once: it is because you do not write to me. I was thinking of not writing to you before I receive a letter from you but afterward I excused you; and I cannot remain any longer without entertaining myself with you. Tell Alexander (Declouet) that I am impatiently expecting what he promised to send me. It is unless, dear Paul, to tell you that I apply myself; but, I will speak to you of my English class. I love it pretty well, with the exception of a book that I cannot bear; it is from I must reflect in order to understand it and I do not know how to reflect; but I study it very hard any hour and I think that after a while I will succeed in learning it well. There are also some duties that do not please me at all; for instance, a supposed letter; I do not know how to compose a letter and this is the reason why I do not write to you oftener.

Adieu dear Paul, kiss Alexander for me.
