Covington, Ky. July 3, 1862

Dear Friend,

In a box shipped to my dear cousin, Sam B. Hawes, of Kentucky, you will find a few articles that may conduce slightly to your comfort while a prisoner of war. I enclose a list, and offer them in the spirit of true friendship. I have just cut out our latest telegraphic news and forward it to cousin Sam.

Among the wounded Louisianians we have had from Shiloh 
P. J. Lefelre of Orleans, now at Camp Chase, Paul Doran New Orleans died
here from amputation, May 17 - Alexis Pocha of New Orleans recovering in
hospital, Bernard of Louisiana Fomehas. Did you know them? I have had
two letters from Nannie H. Howard today. Adieu!
